

This investment includes \$310,000 in general operating support for 9 donated-care model clinics that participate in our Healthcare Access Partners Program.

The Healthcare Access Partners Program provides **five-year funding commitments**, **shared-learning opportunities**, as well as **technical assistance** to help strengthen these community-supported safety net providers.




A Role with a Focus

2019 Foundation Spotlights



Children's Home Society of Idaho | Boise, Idaho

Serving Boise, the Children's Home Society of Idaho was the recipient of a \$15,000 installment as part of a three-year grant of \$50,000. This funding supports an effort to help the most disenfranchised children and to ensure they receive access to mental, behavioral, and emotional healthcare.



Mountain Home Montana | Missoula, Montana

The Missoula nonprofit received a \$30,000 installment as part of a two-year \$55,000 grant to support at-risk families. These resources help Mountain Home Montana further its effort to improve parenting, health, and overall family stability.



Portland Street Medicine | Portland, Oregon

As the recipient of a \$30,000 installment of a two-year \$60,000 grant, Portland Street Medicine is expanding its capacity to bring more medical care for unhoused individuals: More people will be treated on the streets by volunteer providers, social workers, case managers, and community members.



Free Clinic of Southwest Washington | Vancouver, Washington

As the Foundation's inaugural grant in the state of Washington, Free Clinic of Southwest Washington received a \$30,000 one-year grant to support the safety-net clinic's program that allows Community Health Workers to serve as care extenders for diabetic patients.

PacificSource Community Health Excellence (CHE)

The PacificSource Community Health Excellence (CHE) grant program funds healthcare delivery innovations that improve patient care and the health of our communities. Over the last 11 years, CHE has provided over \$6 million in awards that have advanced health care integration, chronic disease management, acute and preventive care, and other innovations.

- Grants are available to contracted PacificSource providers in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington.
- In 2019, the CHE grants program awarded a total of \$630,000 to 12 healthcare organizations in Idaho, Montana, and Oregon.
- Three additional CHE grants totaling \$111,000 were awarded through a contribution from Pacific Health Associates (PHA), a tax-exempt organization affiliated with PacificSource. Those grant recipients included Emergency Responders Health Center (Idaho), Mid-Columbia Medical Center (Oregon), and Yellowstone Boys & Girls Ranch (Montana).

All Seasons Family Care | Idaho

Advancing Primary Care Behavioral Health Reverse Integration

The Primary Care Behavioral Health Reverse Integration Project establishes integrated behavioral health services for All Seasons Family Care clinics in Mountain Home, Nampa, and Boise. The project supports All Seasons' broader efforts to implement team-based care and advance the patient-centered medical home (PCMH) model.



Partnership Health Center | Montana

Establishing Best Practice in Pediatric Panel Management

Partnership Health Center (PHC) is piloting and evaluating the impact of a registered nurse and community-health worker team. This team collaborates to provide routine- and complex-care management to improve health and quality-of-life outcomes for pediatric patients.




Oregon Medical Group | Oregon

Integrating a Population Health Pharmacist to Improve the Care of Patients with Diabetes

Oregon Medical Group (OMG) added a population-health pharmacist to focus solely on patients with diabetes. Data collected throughout the project allows OMG to determine the capacity of a pharmacist-to-patient ratio in their diabetic patient population with the goal of improving outcomes.



United Way

Our commitment and support for the United Way is an employee-powered endeavor, launched every year with a high-energy campaign to raise thousands of dollars through a variety of activities and employee donations. This year, the sum of employee support totaled \$131,787. And the enterprise contributed another \$50,000 for a combined total of \$181,787.

The support to United Way also extends to the annual Day of Caring at PacificSource: A team of employees spends four hours working at a United Way-supported organization. We also participate in the Loaned Executive program, allowing an employee to spend several months working on behalf of the United Way while remaining on PacificSource payroll and benefits.
