General description	The CHE Grants Program supports provider-driven innovation and continuous improvement. Who is eligible to apply?	Applicants must hold a contract with PacificSource, and be geographically located in communities where PacificSource does business. Nonprofit and for-profit organizations may apply.	Applicants must be an 501(c)(3) organization or meet IRS requirements for a tax-exempt organization. Funds must benefit people in the communities we serve: Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington.				
What are the funding priorities? An independent, private foundation, not connected to any PacificSource entity, the PacificSource Foundation for Health Improvement is focused on advancing health equity and improving access to healthcare.

Applicants must be a 501(c)(3) organization or otherwise meet IRS requirements for a tax-exempt organization.

Organizations must be based in Oregon, Idaho, Montana, or within Washington's Clark, Spokane, or Pierce Counties.

The primary aim is **advancing health equity** through strategies that increase **access to healthcare** and eliminate health disparities for marginalized people and communities.

The funding priorities:

- Healthcare access (direct and indirect)
- Prevention/intervention strategies

What sort of funding is provided?	One-year grants are a maximum of \$100,000 and awards typically range between \$25,000 and \$75,000. Multi-year grants are a maximum of \$150,000 and awards typically range between \$120,000 and \$150,000. • Requires letter of intent and invite to apply Exclusions include: Capital expenses, building or infrastructure remodeling, medical equipment or supplies, electronic medical records, and consulting services.	This program provides small grants and event sponsorships. Awards typically range between \$250 and \$2,500. Requests for volunteers are also welcome.	One-year and multi-year grants have a typical grant range of \$10,000-\$50,000. These may include program-specific grants and general operating grants, as appropriate (especially for healthcare access). Funding for key equipment and/or extending capacity may be eligible.

How frequent is the funding cycle?	Annual funding cycle, December- November. Multi-year grants require a letter of intent. See timeline for the current grant cycle on the CHE grants web page.	Grant cycles begin January 1, and remain open until all funds are expended regionally, or on December 31. Committees typically convene every other month to review requests. Committees vet and respond to requests within 12 weeks.	Quarterly funding cycles. Ongoing letter of intent (LOI) submission.
Are there specific exclusions?	This program does not support event sponsorships, capital or building expenses, medical equipment or supplies, computer hardware or EMRs, consulting services, or long-term studies.	This program does not support political, or arts-related requests. Religious organizations must not require participation in religious services or programming in order to receive funds.
